

## Proposed Revision of Academic Computing Committee Description (approved by Government committee Feb. 22, 2019)

### Previous description

#### a. Academic Computing

Charge: The Academic Computing Committee shall serve as a policy formulation body with respect to academic computing and related activities. The Committee shall act in an advisory capacity to the Senate and to members of the University administration. The Committee shall report to the Vice Chancellor for Information Technology and Planning and the Associate Vice Chancellor for Information Technology.

Membership: One (1) one voting General Faculty member from each electoral division, plus one (1) Senator appointed by the Chair of the Senate. Nonvoting: Associate Vice Chancellor for Client Services and a representative of the University Teaching and Learning Commons.

### Revision

#### a. Academic Computing

Charge: The Academic Computing Committee investigates and makes recommendations on information technology issues of concern to faculty and major technology initiatives and changes proposed by Information Technology Services. The committee solicits direct faculty input regarding information technology. The committee will forward its recommendation(s) to the Senate, the Provost, and the Vice Chancellor of Information Technology Services. The chair of the ACC or designee serves as a member of other computing committees: Academic Technology Coordinating Committee, Administrative Information Security Committee, and the Faculty Senate Online Learning Committee.

Membership: One (1) voting member of the General Faculty from each unit, plus one (1) Senator appointed by the Chair of the Senate. Nonvoting: One (1) or more representatives from Information Technology Services (ITS) and one member from the Office of the Provost. Committee members are expected to bring to the ACC the academic computing needs of faculty from their unit and to communicate the results of discussions and suggestions of the ACC to the faculty.
